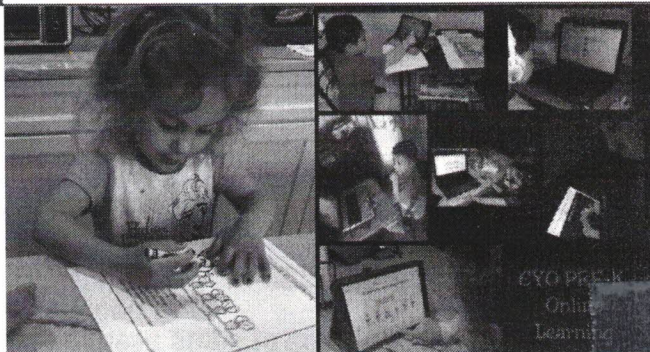


## CENSUS 2020
